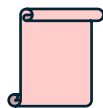
It started over 100 years ago, in 1911, to support women's rights, like the right to vote and work fairly.



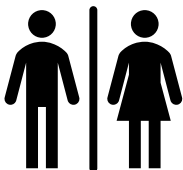
